Last year, the school purchased outside gym equipment, this year we will be monitoring the use and impact of the new gym. Pupils with Educational Healthcare Plans are given specified times to allow them to improve their fitness, balance, stamina and general physical wellbeing.



The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following Objectives and Indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles

2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
6. All the children have the opportunity to participate in either multi-sports, karate or gymnastics throughout their time at Mayville Primary School.
7. Providing swimming lessons to more pupils and increasing the amount of lessons.

Mayville Primary School prioritised the use of the Sports Premium Funding as follows:

Hiring specialist PE teachers and qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE.

Supporting and engaging the least active children through new and additional Change4Life clubs.

Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.

Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport.

Running sport competitions, and increasing pupil's participation in the School Games.

Buying quality assured professional development modules and materials for PE and sport.

Help to fight childhood obesity.

Introducing a specialist nutritionist to promote healthy eating and teach the pupils how to create a balanced and healthy diet for life.

PE Coordinator feedback on impact so far:

So far this year, we have achieved considerable success in Level 2 competitions

- Year 5/6 Girls football team finished 3rd in the regional finals
- Year 5/6 Tag Rugby competition- reached the Quarter Finals
- Year 5/6 Cross Country- first time competing in the competition

To achieve the Bronze Award School games mark we have:

- established a Change4life club to engage the least involved children in our school

- established a PE Council so that children can have a say in the way PE Premium is spent and decision involving PE Provision and resources (so far children had made decisions about playground resources)
- school engaging in more level 2 interschool competitions
- School engaging in more level 1 interschool competitions
- Provide the children with more opportunities to take leadership opportunities in Level 1 competitions and produce reports and take photographs

To ensure that we meet the upcoming National Curriculum requirement for children to have 30 minutes' minimum exercise each day we are implementing:

- Bringing in more equipment to engage children at break time
- Using trained Year 4/5 children to be role models in our school for healthy living and Change4life
- Using resources such as 'Go Noodle' to encourage physical activity in classrooms and during wet play sessions
- Training children to be playground mentors and play with children who have no one to play with
- Provide more resources and games to encourage positive play on the playground
